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Grocery store to anchor MiraBay Village

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MiraBay Village is getting a Sweetbay Supermarket.

The grocery chain will build a 50,000-square-foot store to anchor the 31-acre MiraBay Village near the entrance to MiraBay, the 750-acre, master-planned community in southern Hillsborough County.

Construction is expected to begin in the spring. The supermarket and some retail space in the shopping center should open in the summer of 2008, a release said.

Sweetbay is a subsidiary of Delhaize America, the U.S. division of Brussels-based Delhaize Group, whose food operations are in 10 countries on three continents. The company owns nearly 2,600 stores, including one at FishHawk Ranch, also developed by Newland Communities, which develops MiraBay.

Tampa-based Sweetbay was developed in 2004 by the Delhaize Group to replace Kash n' Karry stores.

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
